Terry kept the footprint of the old kitchen but gutted it in favour of a decker look. She donated all of the previous owner's appliances to Habitat for Humanity and then outfitted the newly designed space with Wolf appliances. The counters and island are topped with quartz. The bar stools were sourced from Hickory Chair. A laundry room, with stacked washer and dryer and a slate floor, is tucked behind a door at the far end of the kitchen.



The serenity starts at the entrance and continues into a long hallway, with its paneled, pilastered walls and rich hardwood floor. A set of doors to the right leads to the sleeping quarters, including the master suite outfitted with a king-sized upholstered Paris bed and an Empire chest from Baker's Thomas Pheasant Collection; a guest bedroom, and a bedroom-turned-walk-in closet ("I have lots of clothes—even though I always wear the same thing," laughs Terry).

With no windows in the hallway, the entrance is dark even on the brightest day. But all is forgiven when the hall spills into the great room, which Krachtling calls his "wow factor." During the day, light streams in from three directions, thanks to a series of floor-to-ceiling, west-facing windows in the living and dining rooms and a north-facing bank of windows and French doors. The doors open onto a 1,500-square-foot terrace that runs along the entire north side of

the suite. The cozy family room is where Terry and Dylan usually end up at the end of the day. A third bedroom just off the great room is currently used for storage. "It's where things come to die before I give them away," Terry quips. *[P]*

Terry enjoys spending downtime in the family room's cozy custom-made sectional sofa or chaise longue, both by CCF Custom Furnishings. Come springtime, she opens the doors to the 1,500-square-foot patio, and she and Dylan bask in the breeze.
